

4 Year Universities / Colleges



California Community Colleges (CCC)

- 113 campuses
- Total Spring 2015 enrollment: 1,485,407 students
- Open to any student pursuing higher education (18+ or Diploma/GED)

California Community Colleges Offer:

- HS Concurrent Enrollment
- Basic skills and English as a second language
- Job skills
- No minimum GPA
- HS Diploma or equivalent only requirement
- Certificate Programs
- Associate Degrees
- Transfer to a 4-Year University/College
- Flexible schedules (Day, evening, and weekend classes)

California State University 23 Campuses in CA (CSU)

- One of the largest higher education system in the country
- 460,000 students,
- Bachelors and Master's Degrees
- One of the nation's most diverse higher educational institutions



California State University

- Eligibility Requirements:
 - <u>A-G Courses</u>
 - <u>2.0 GPA Minimum</u>
 - <u>SAT Reasoning</u> Exam Score or <u>ACT</u> Exam Score
- Applications accepted from <u>October 1st to November 30th</u>
 - https://www2.calstate.edu/apply
- Impacted campuses and majors may have stricter or additional requirements. Just because you have a 2.0, does not guarantee you will get in to the campus of your choice.

University of California (UC)

- 10 campuses in CA only 9 open for undergraduates
- UC Merced (2005) newest UC in 40 years.
- 250,000 students total
- Focus on teaching, research and public service

University of California

- Minimum <u>GPA is 3.0</u>
- Application is based upon:
 - <u>A-G Courses</u> and <u>GPA</u>
 - <u>SAT Reasoning</u> or <u>ACT with Writing</u>
 - <u>2 SAT Subject Tests for some majors</u>
 - <u>Extracurricular Activities</u> and <u>Involvement</u>
 - Personal Statement
 - Letters of Recommendation (UC Berkeley only)
- Applications accepted from <u>November 1st to November 30th</u>
 - Applications are available now and we will be working on them during bootcamp

"a-g" Course Requirements

- a. History/Social Science 2 years
- b. English 4 years
- c. Mathematics 3 years (4 years recommended)
- d. Laboratory Science 2 years (3 years recommended)
- e. Language Other Than English 2 years (3 years recommended)
- f. Visual and Performing Arts 1 year
- g. College-Preparatory Elective 1 year

Private/Independent Colleges & Universities

- Around 1600 Private Universities and Collegess in the US.
- About 70 of them are in California
- Provide large <u>scholarship/financial</u> <u>aid packages</u>
- <u>Smaller class size and faster</u> <u>graduation rates</u>
- <u>Requirements and Deadlines will</u> <u>VARY</u>

What is Naviance?

- Portal for you to organize your application materials.
 - Send information to colleges (letters of Recommendation)
 - See if your profile makes you a good match for this school
 - Help you find scholarships
 - Update Ms. O on how the college process is going and what needs to be sent.
- Share it with your family
 - Show your parents all you are doing on Naviance!

 - One place you can apply to all the CSU campuses
- Common App <u>www.commonapp.org</u>
 - One application that you can submit to multiple schools
 - Supplemental questions may be asked for certain schools.

 - One place to apply to the UC campuses.

Types of Applications

- Early Action
 - When a student applies early but does not have to let the school know they will be attending until May 1st.
- Early Decision
 - When you apply early decision and are admitted, you must attend that university.
 - This may also be called a binding decision
- Single Choice Early Action
 - When a school only allows you to apply to one school early action
- Deferred Decision "the Holding Pattern"
 - The school is not ready to make a decision and would like to hold on to your application and make a decision a bit later.
